

SAMPLE SCHEDULE MODEL – Double major in German and Psychology

This plan assumes that the student has entered the university with credit for German 1101 and English 1110, which is typical of many German students. Summer study abroad can replace 3-9 credits toward the German major, or a semester or year abroad can be planned.
