Having received his Ph.D. from Washington University in 1979, Professor Berman is considered a leading expert in the fields of literary, aesthetic, and cultural theories. Other interests include German literature since the 18th century, contemporary literature of the FRG, GDR, and Austria, and the development of German prose.

In addition to numerous articles (critical theory, public sphere, literature and film, fascism, Sachs, Landauer, Becher, etc.) he authored <u>Between Fontane and Tucholsky; Literary Criticism and the</u> <u>Public Sphere in Imperial Germany</u> (1983), <u>The Rise of the Modern German Novel; Crisis and</u> <u>Charisma</u> (1986), and <u>Modern Culture and Critical Theory: Art, Politics, and the Legacy of the</u> <u>Frankfurt School</u> (1988). Professor Berman has most recently been affiliated with Stanford University and Columbia University.
