He has held visiting positions at Georgetown and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, is a past president of the Kafka Society of America, and the recipient of numerous prizes for his research and creative writing, most recently the Elisabeth Frazer de Bussy Prose-Prize in 1988.
